

2020 Ag Snapshots

A brief focus on Georgia's agricultural industry

Agriculture, a driving force for local economies across Georgia, has long shaped the state's history. The 2020 Ag Snapshots report on Georgia's agricultural economy is based on the 2018 Georgia Farm Gate Value Report, an annual, county-level economic valuation for all food and fiber production in the state. Together these commodities directly represent a value of over \$13.76 billion to the Georgia economy.

Beyond their farm gate values, these commodities form a foundation for our diverse agricultural supply chain, providing key resources to many sectors and adding value within the economy. Ag Snapshots provides the output and jobs supported by food and fiber production, which include the directly related industries along the supply chain — the total economic contribution — to highlight the importance of the agricultural economy to Georgia. In 2018, food and fiber production and related industries represented \$76 billion in output to Georgia's \$1.07 trillion economy and more than 399,200 jobs in the economy.






2018 TOTAL FARM GATE VALUE





The economic contribution of food and fiber plus related industries adds up to over \$7,100 per person in Georgia.

2018 Georgia Farm Gate Value = \$5.71 billion 2017 = \$5.47 billion









3 out of 4 Georgia counties are involved in poultry and egg production.

2018 Georgia Farm Gate Value = \$2.23 billion 2017 = \$2.55 billion






Cotton ranks No. 1 in production value among row and forage crops in Georgia and No. 2 in the nation.



2018 Georgia Farm Gate Value = \$1.41 billion 2017 = \$1.43 billion






Beef and dairy ranked among the top 10 commodities in the 2018 Georgia Farm Gate Value Report.


This category includes commodities ranging from catfish to honeybees.






2018 Georgia Farm Gate Value = \$888.72 million 2017 = \$846.47 million









Both greenhouses and container nurseries ranked among the top 20 in farm gate value among agricultural commodities in 2018.



















NUMBER OF FARMS BY COUNTY


