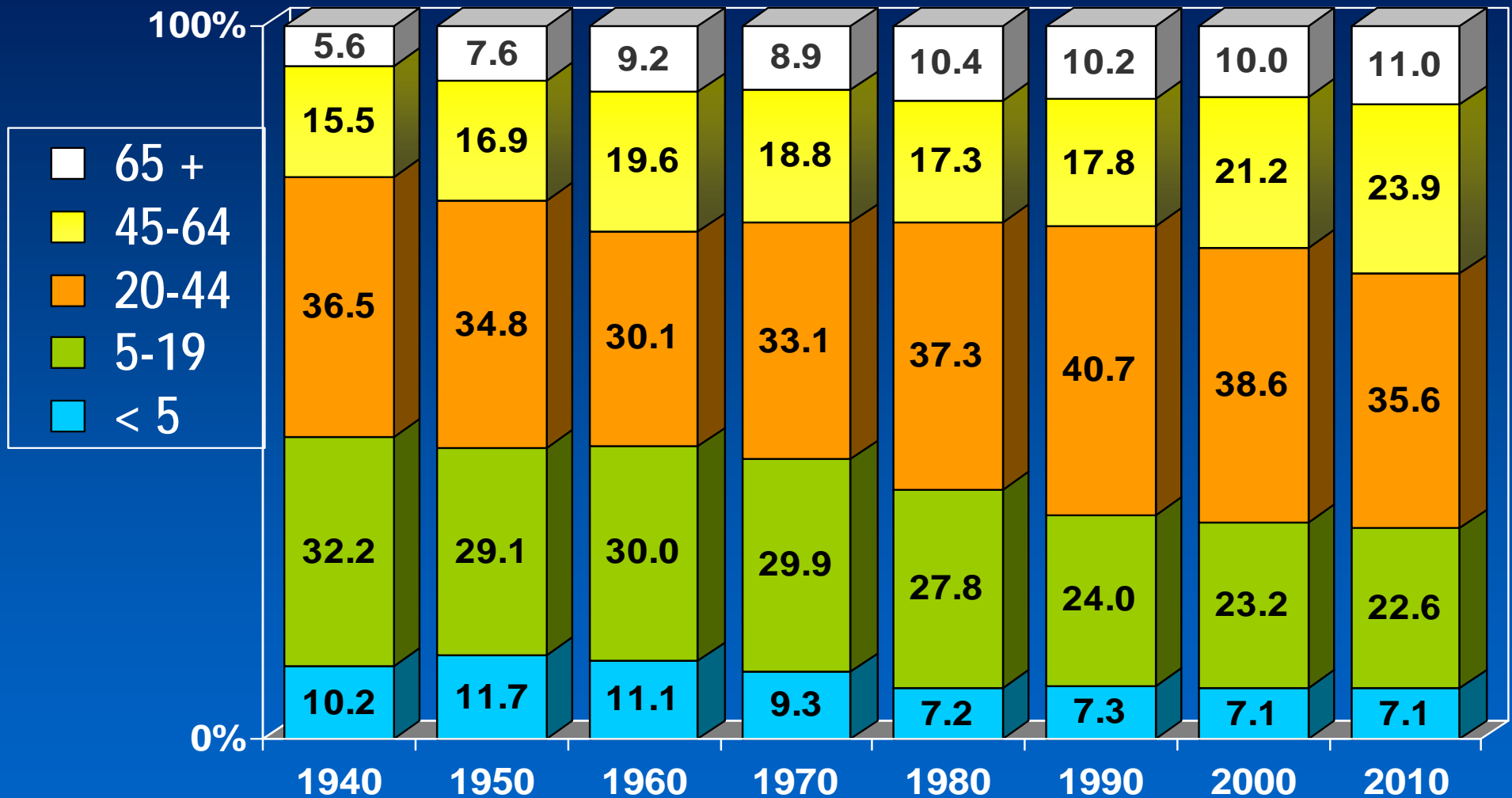

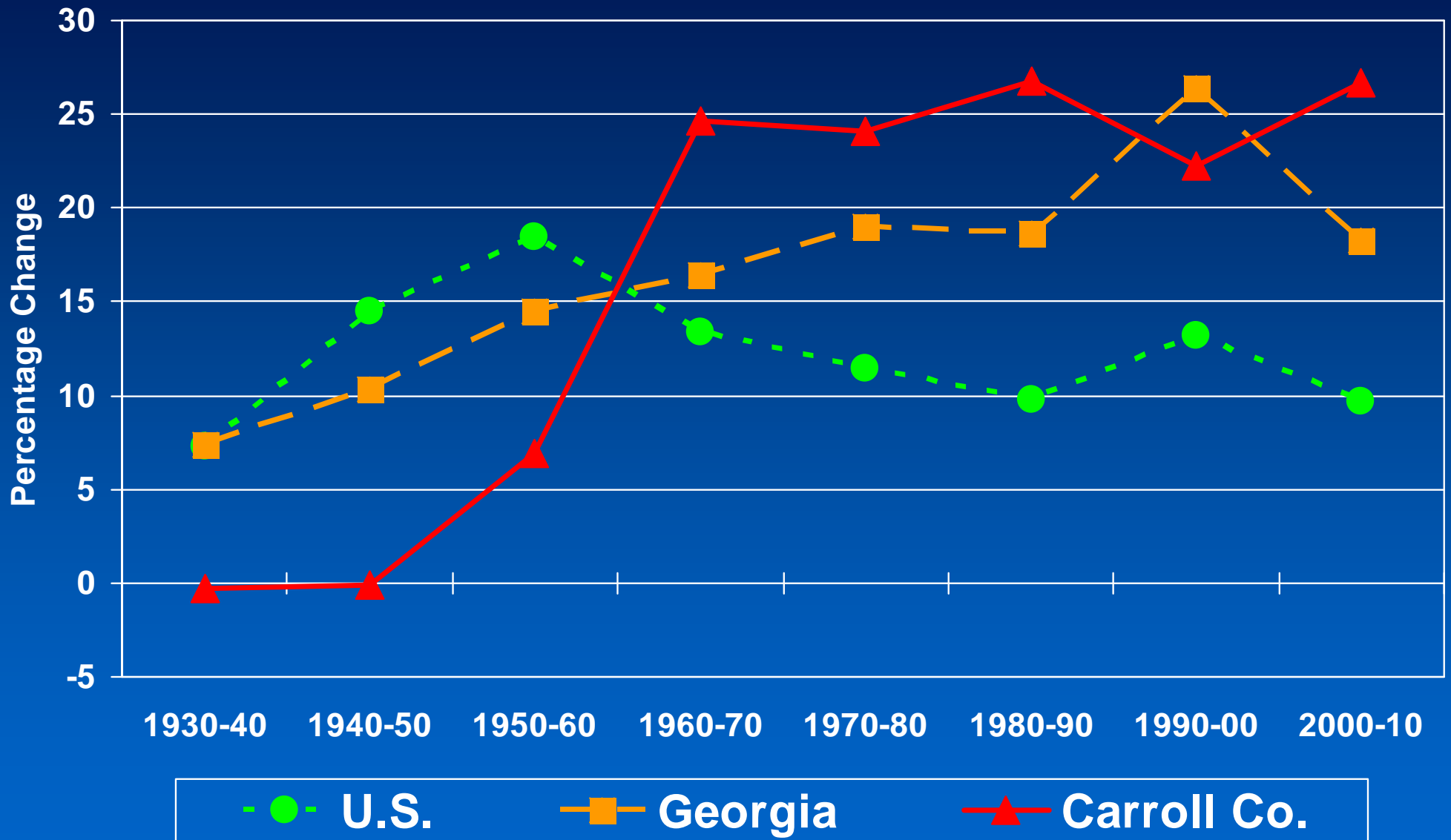

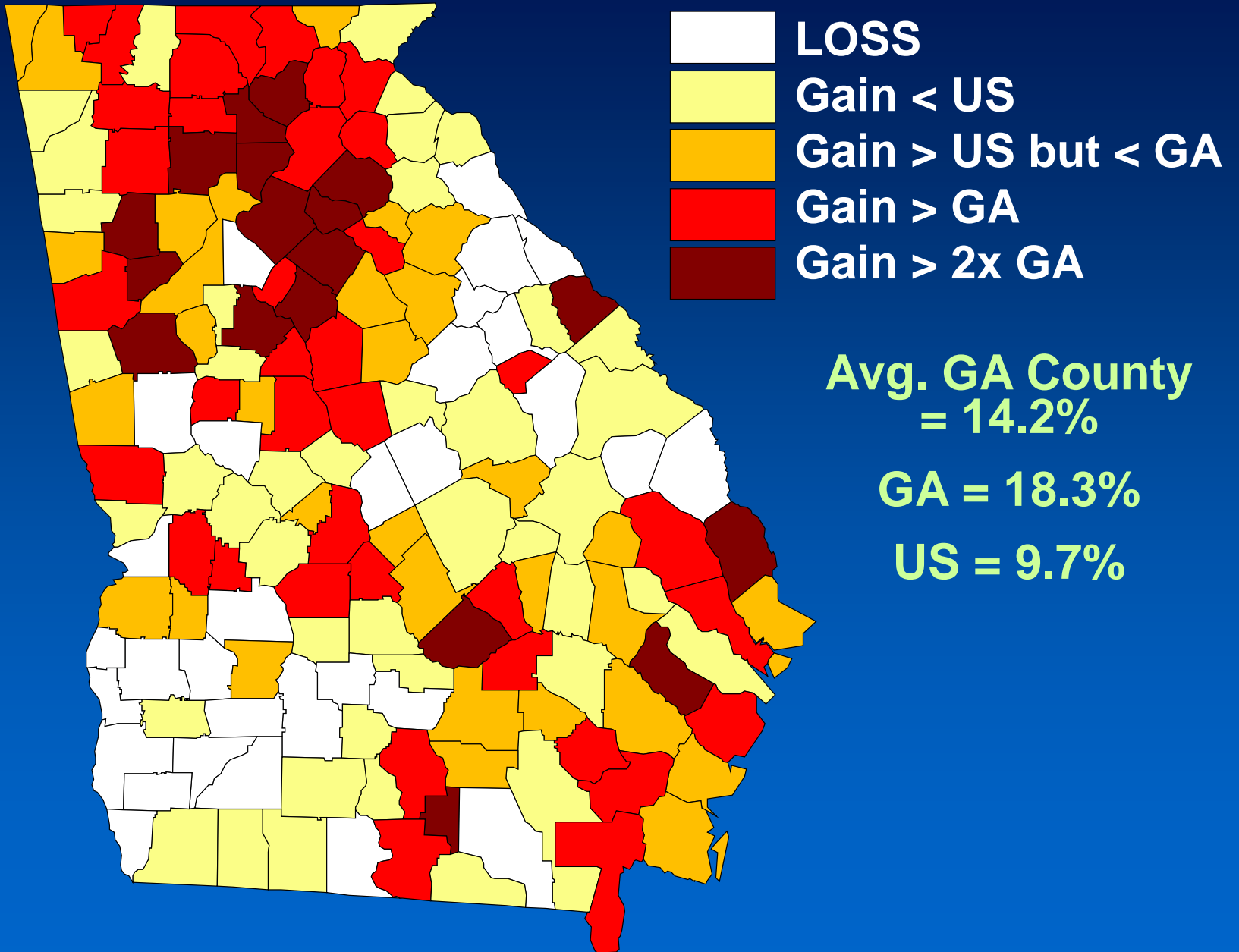

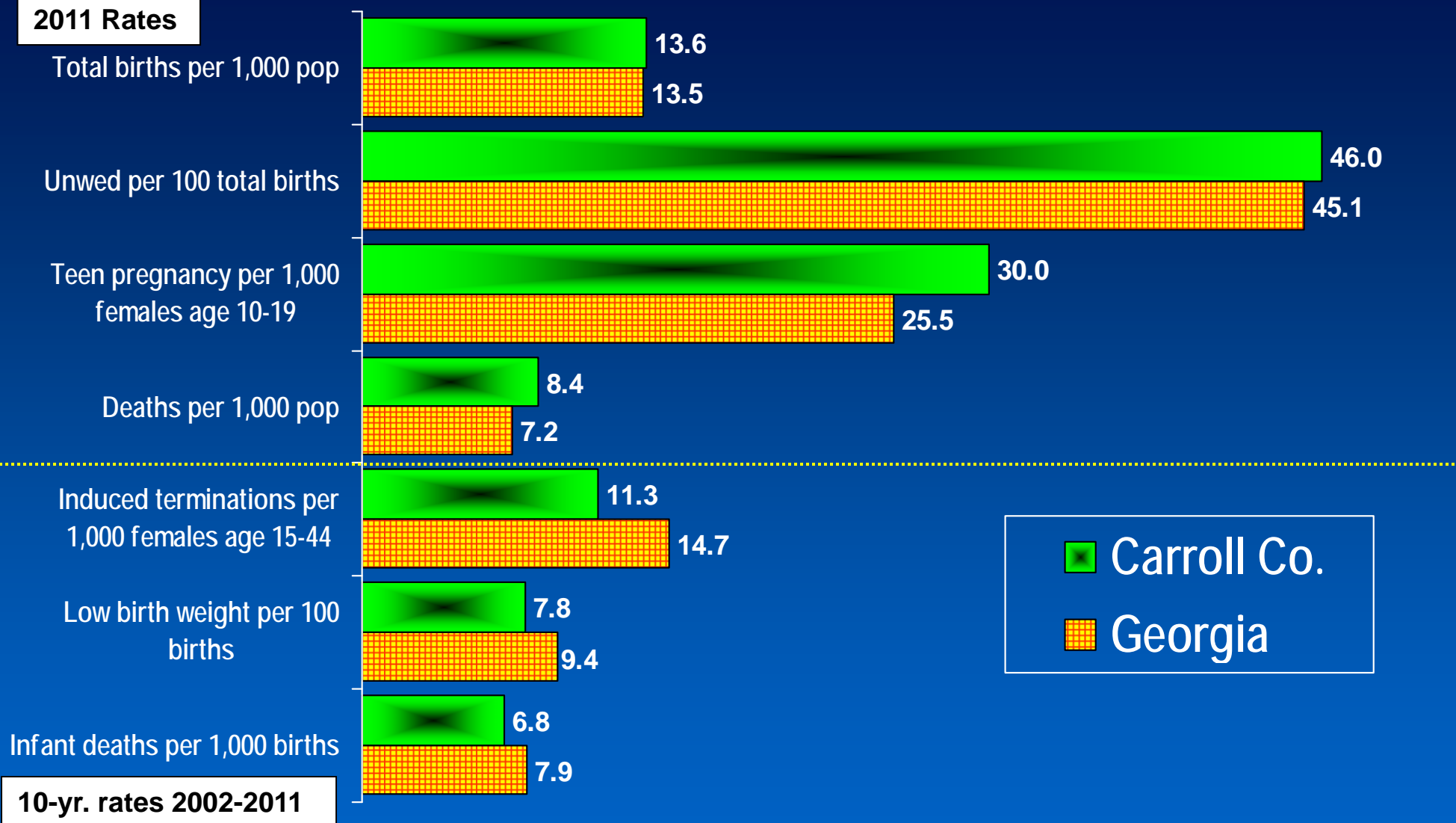

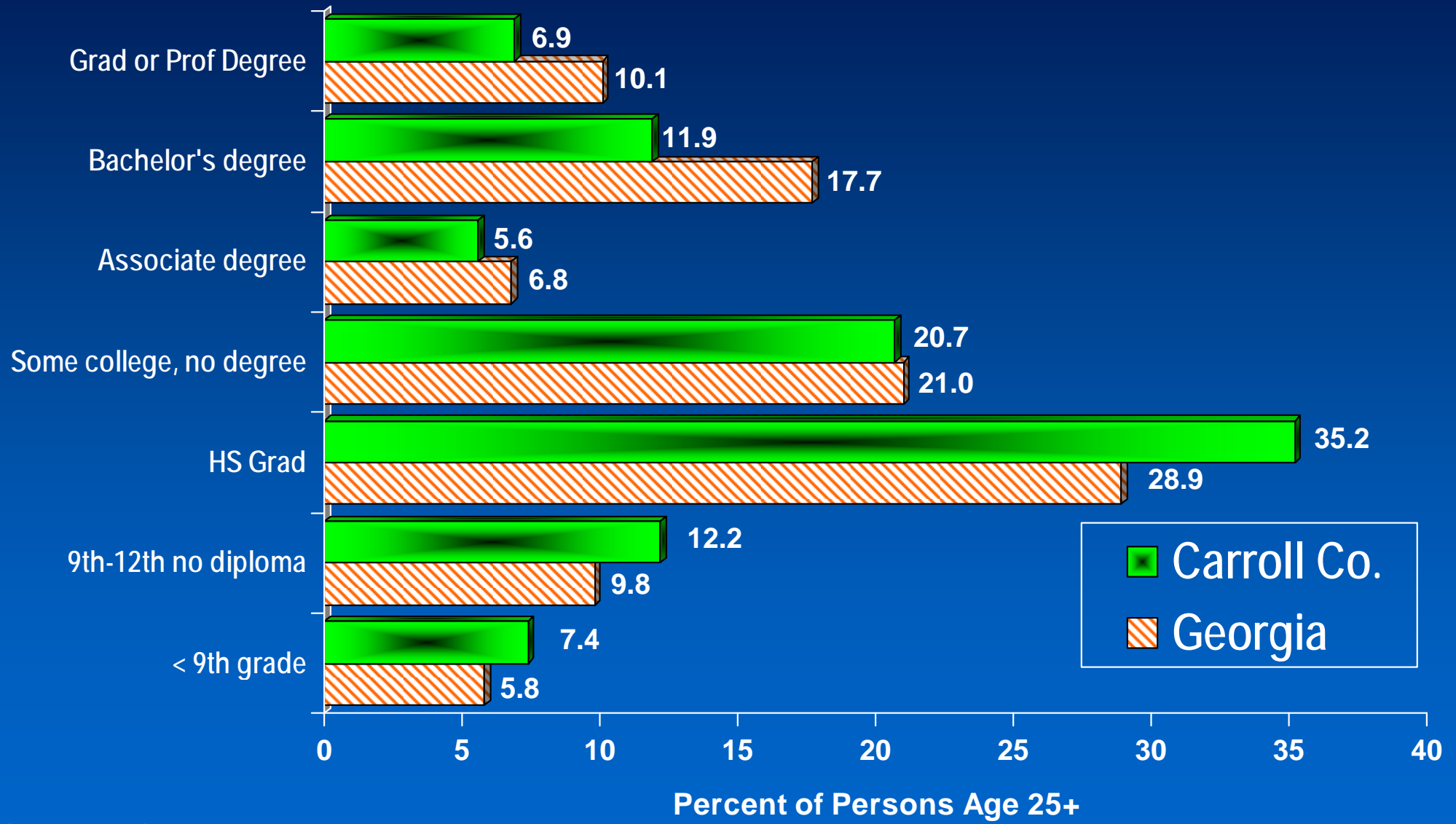

5 Yr. Avg. – American Community Survey



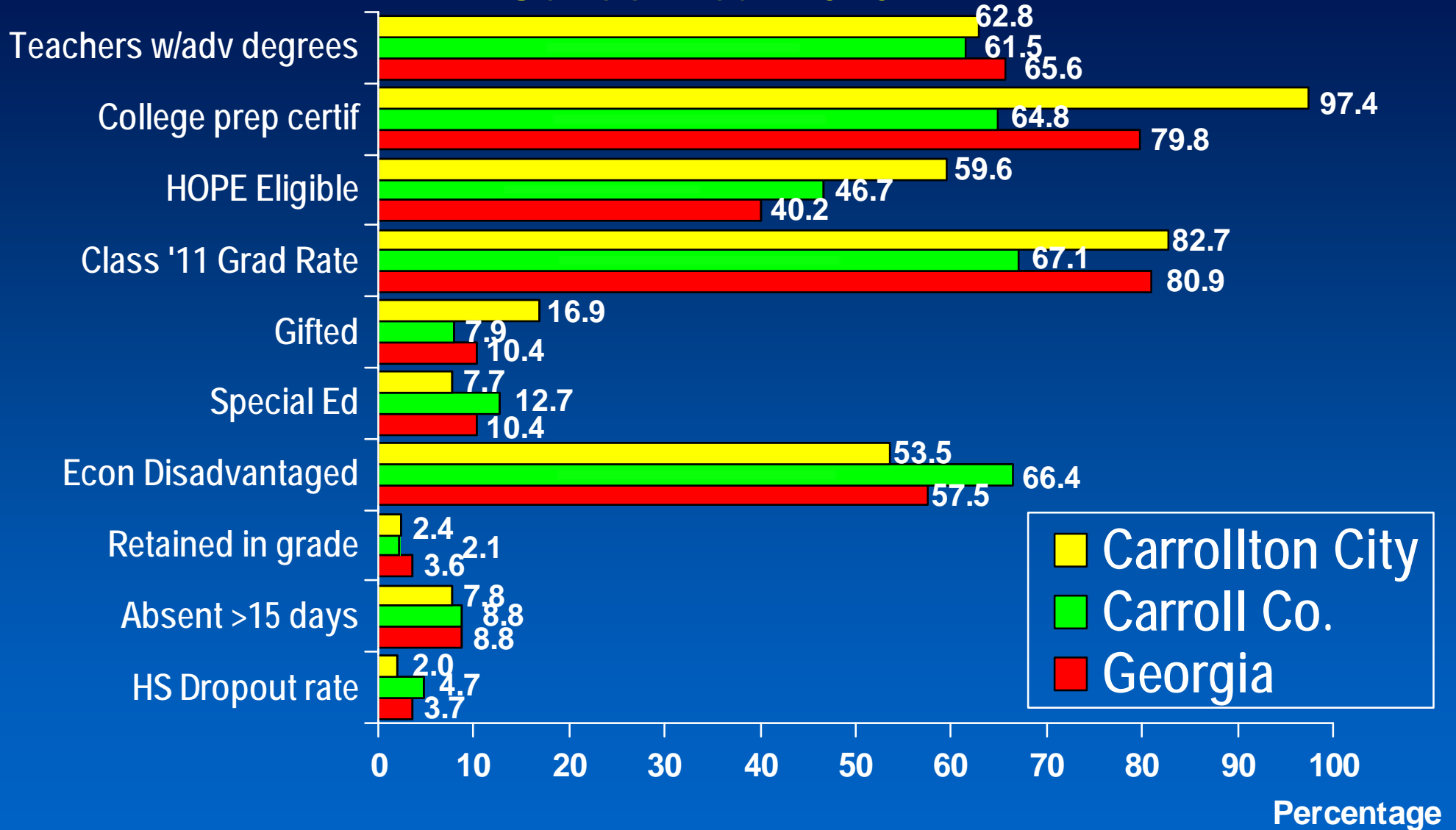

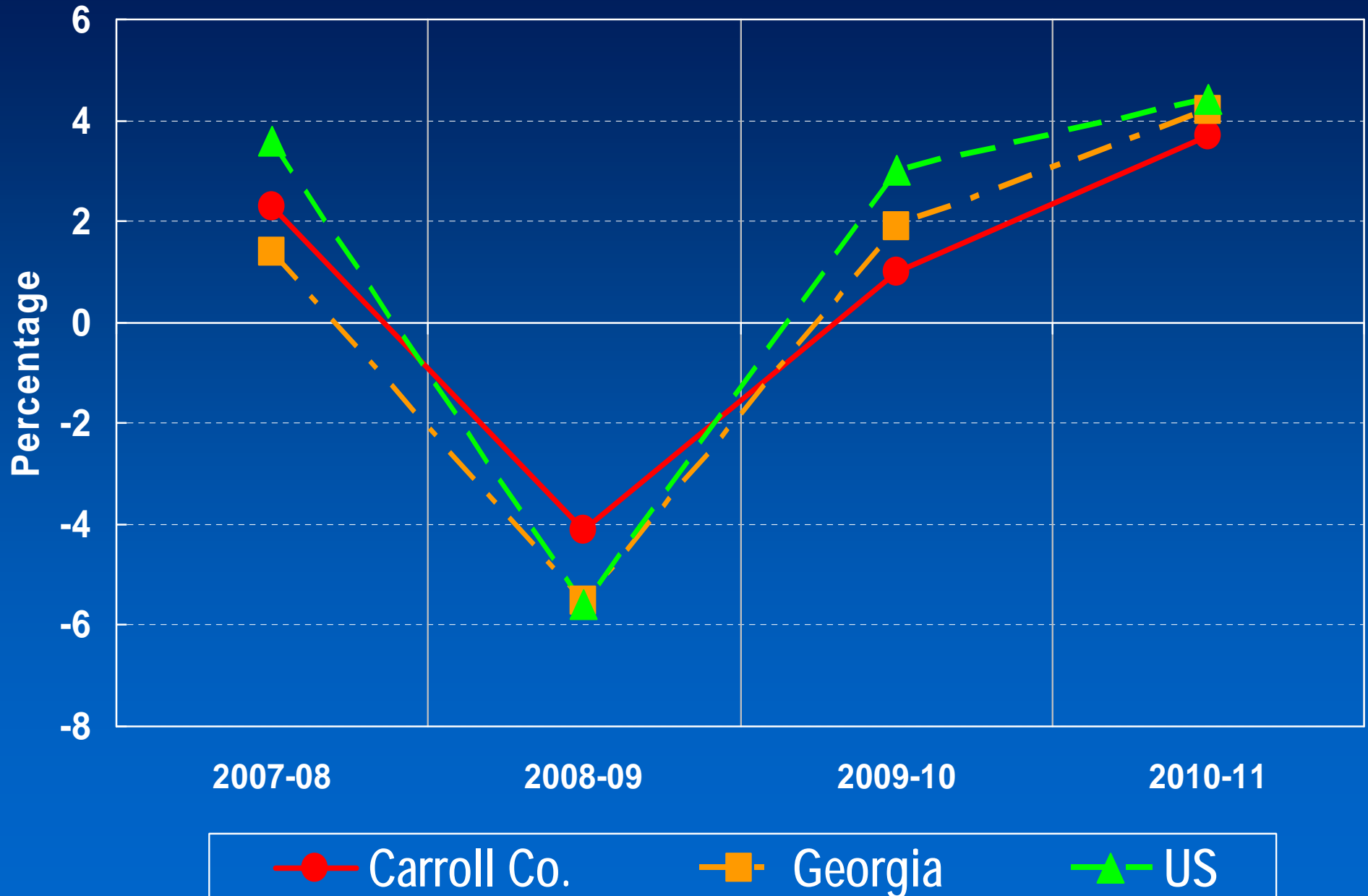

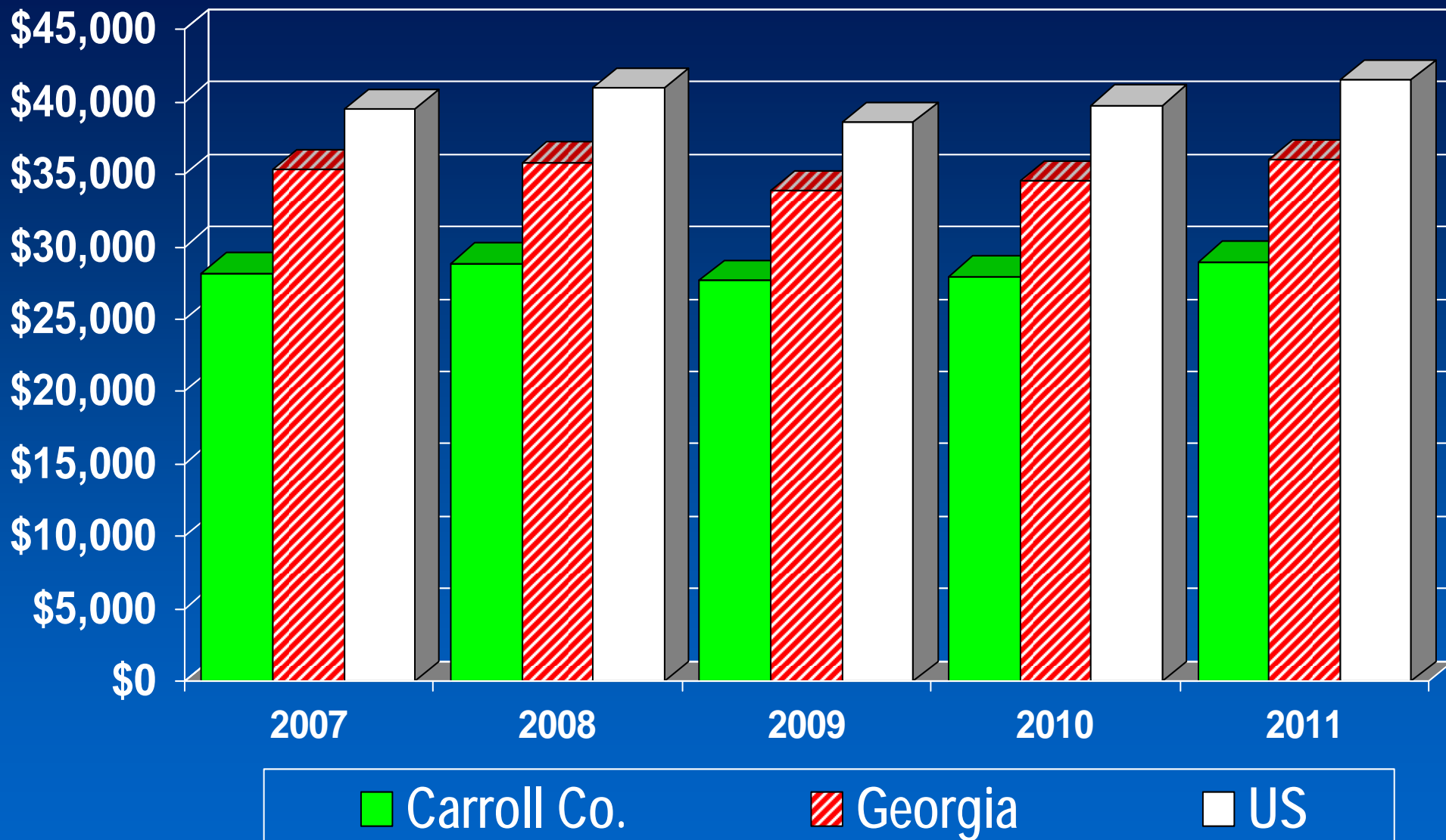

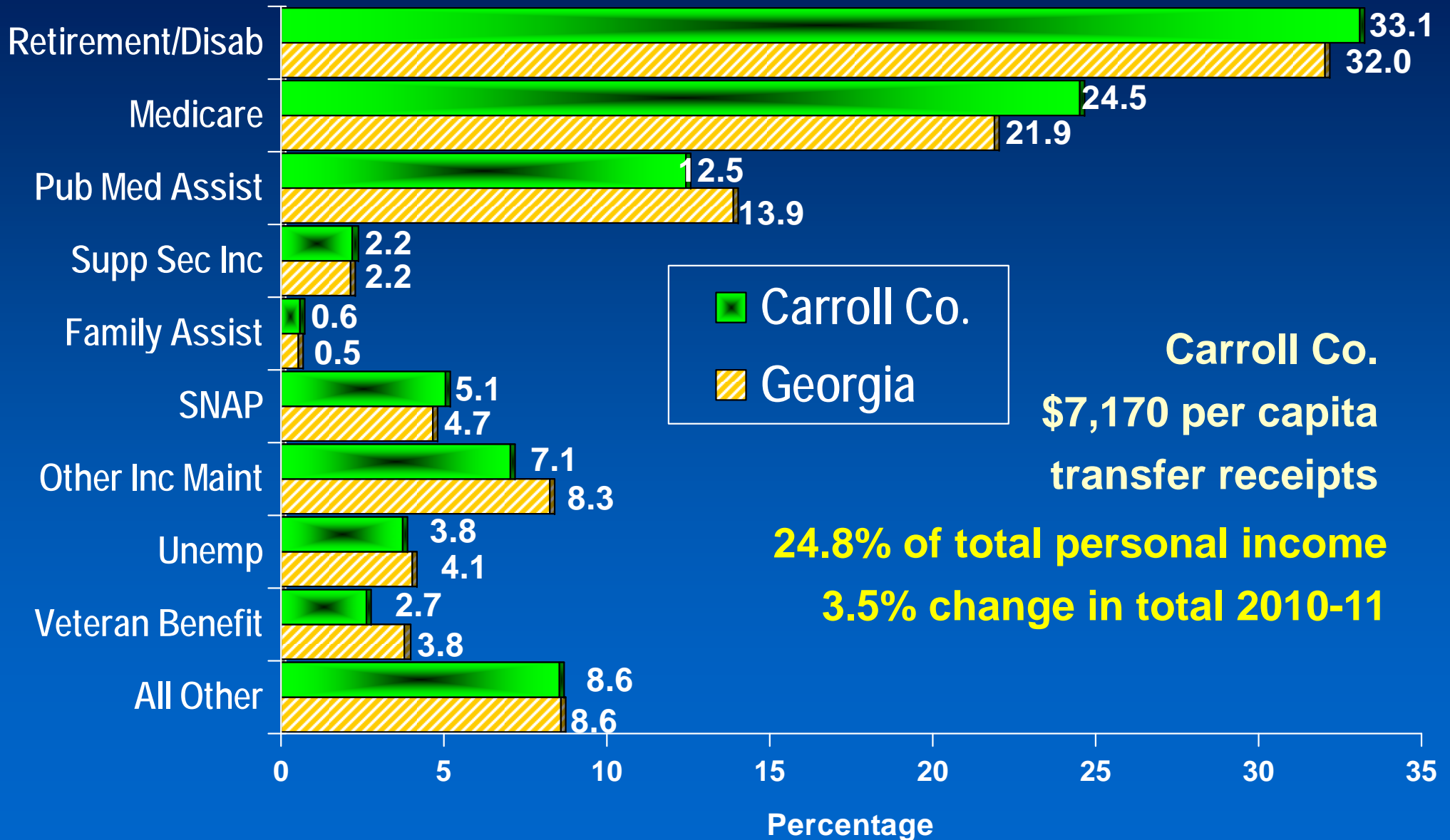

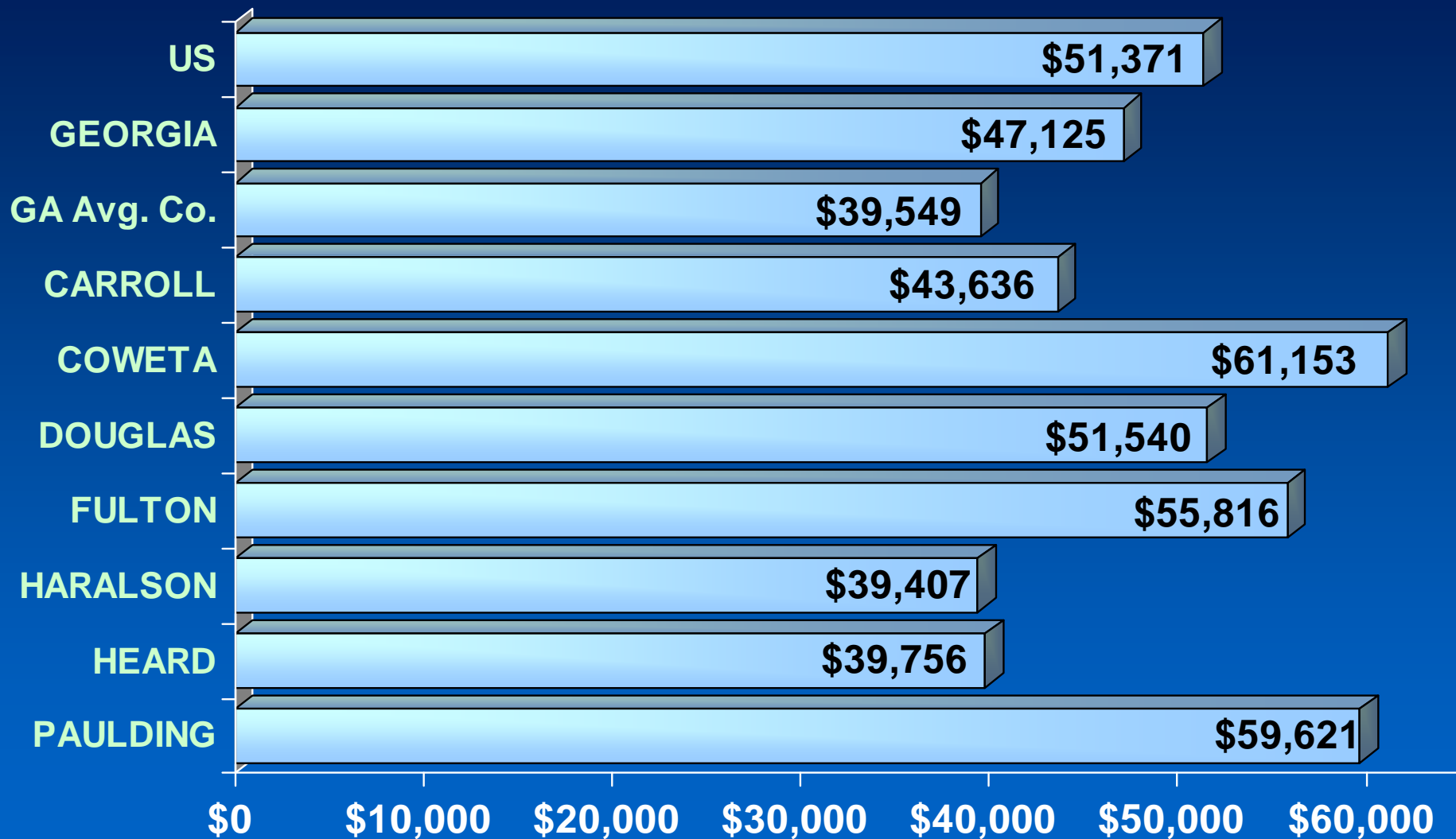

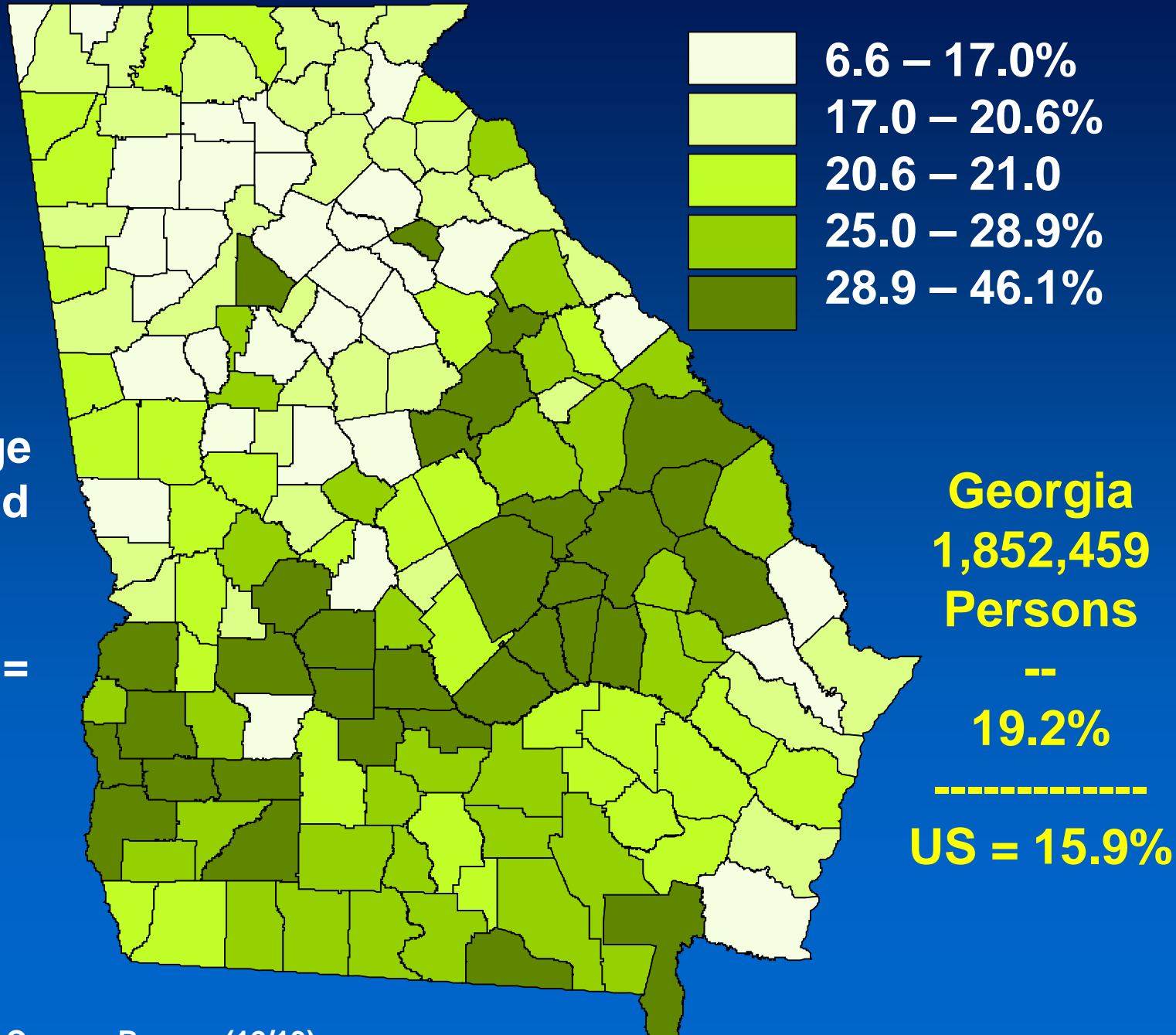

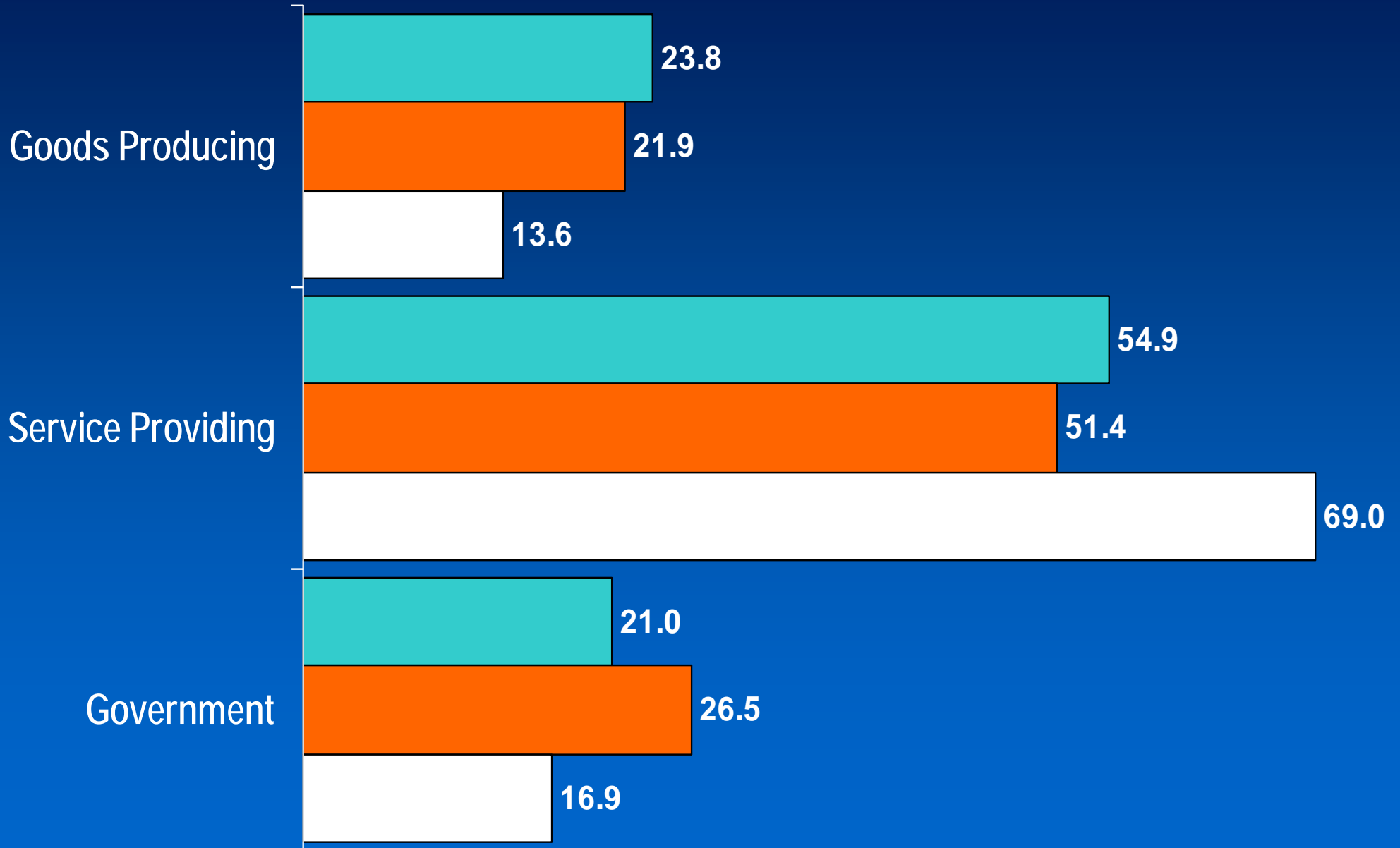

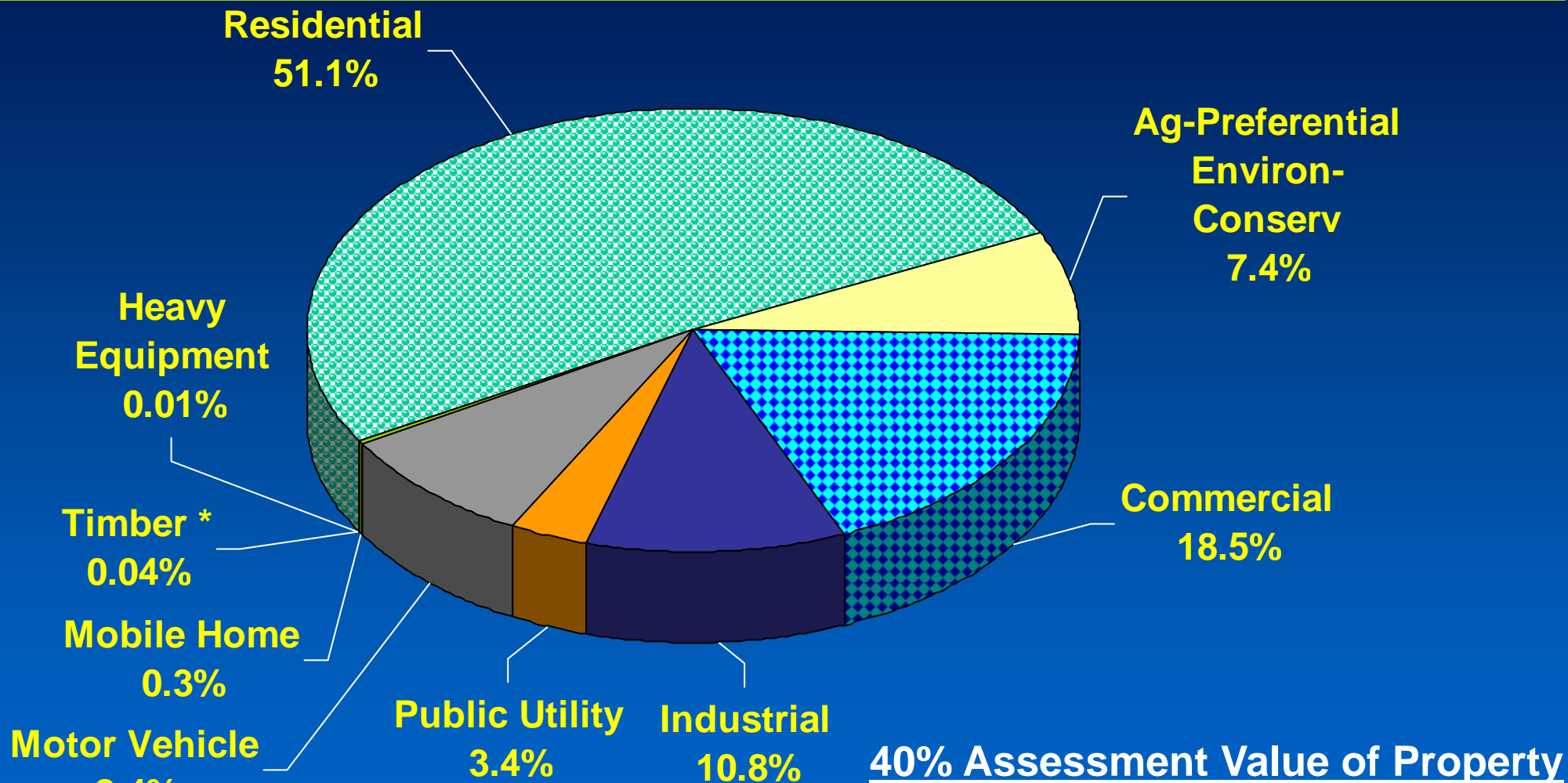

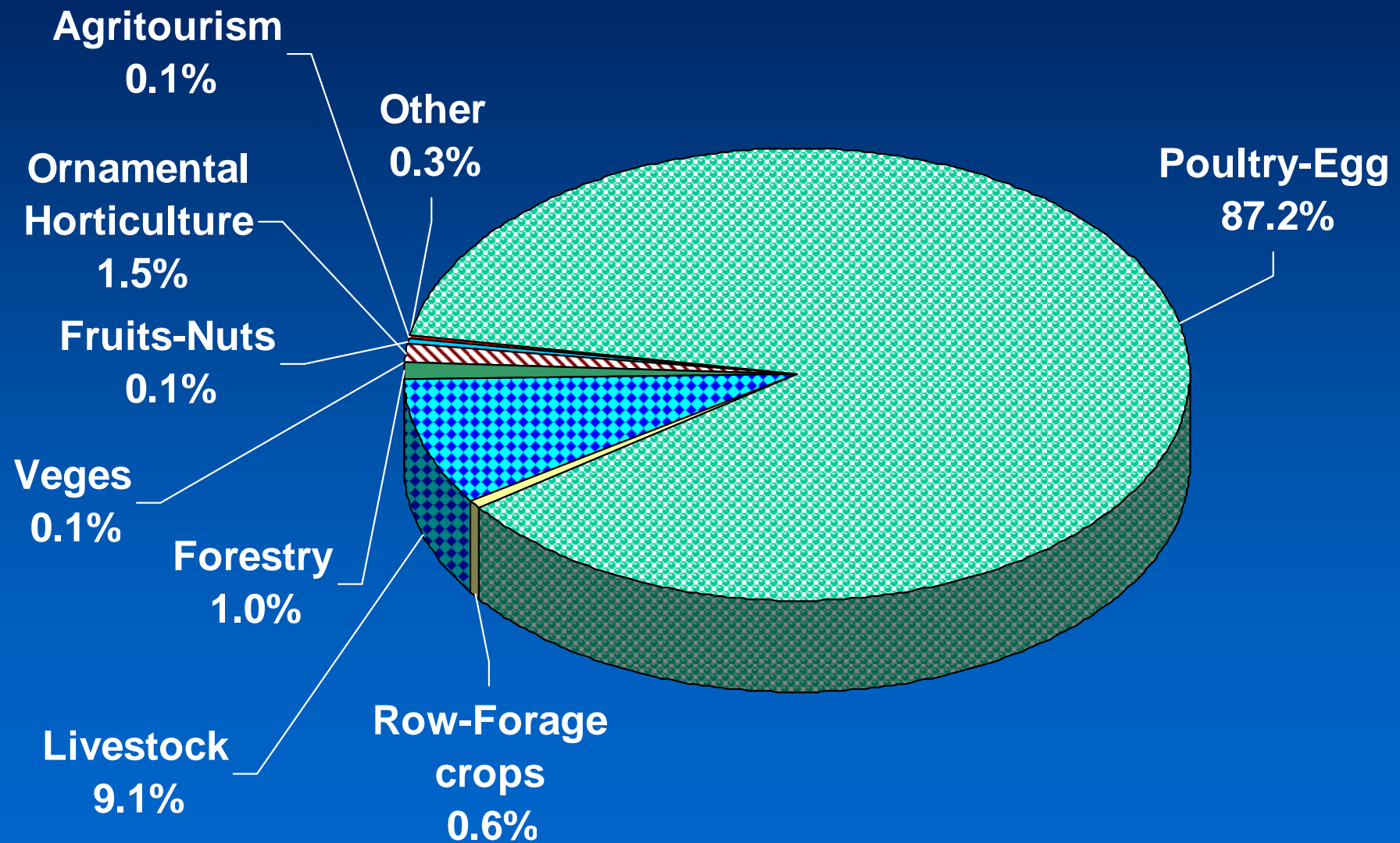

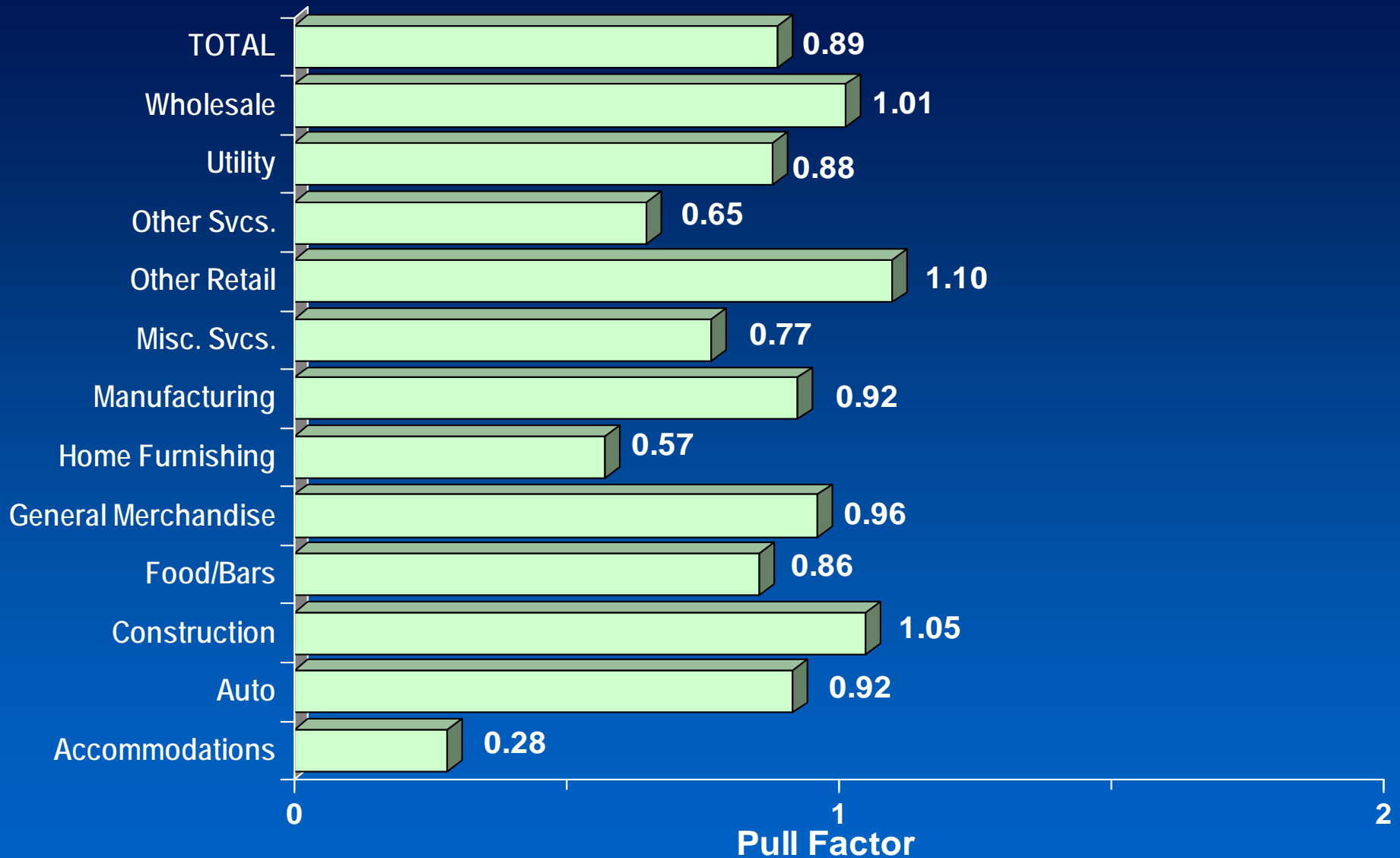
Farm Gate Value by Commodity Group: 2012

1% Sales & Use Tax Distributions: 2012

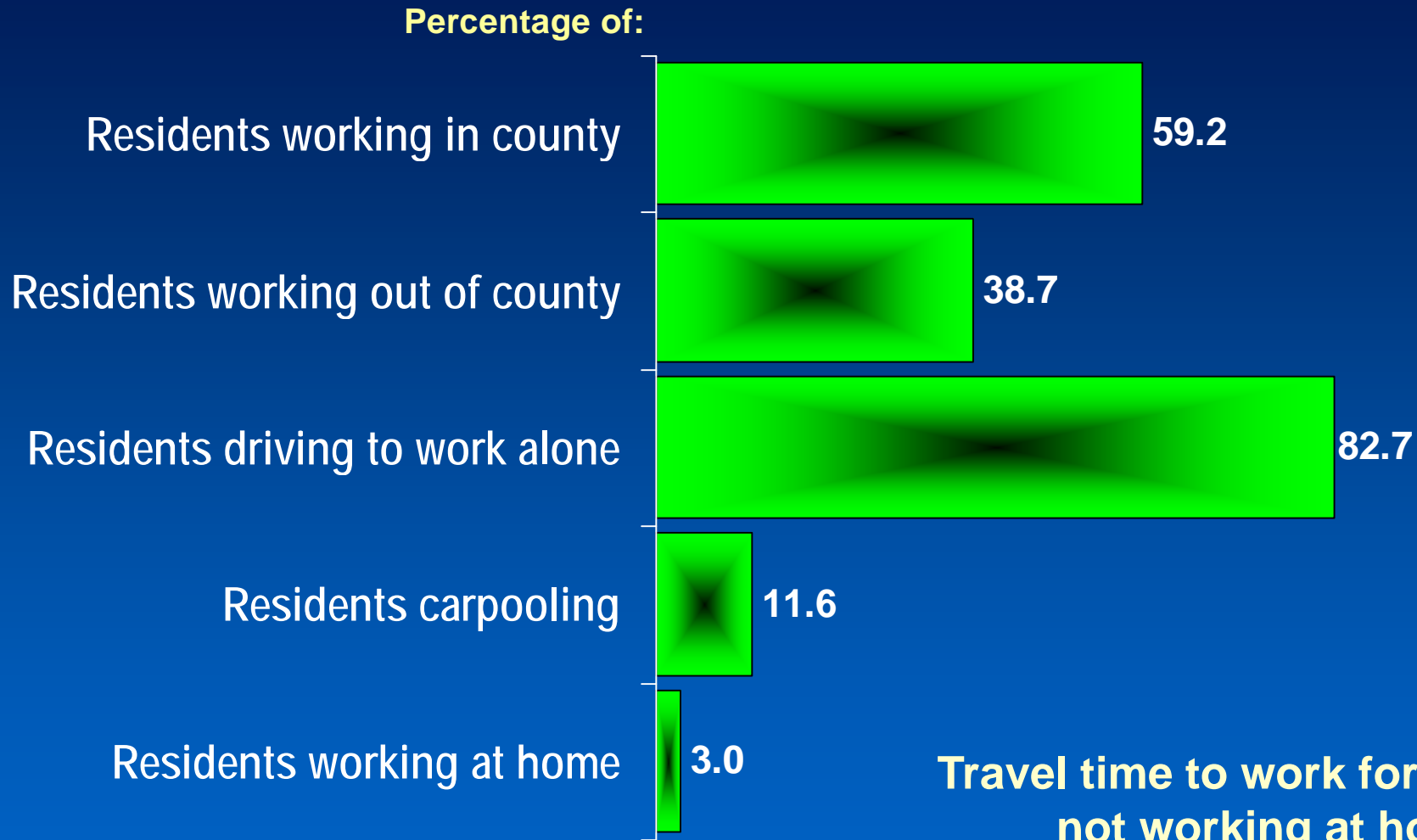
