



2013 Median Age Forsyth Co. = 37.9 yrs. **GA** = 35.9 yrs.





### Population Change: 2000-2010






## Highest Level of Educational Attainment: 2009-2013 5 Yr. Avg. – American Community Survey





#### Per Capita Income: 2009-2013



## Median Household Income 2013 Model-Based Estimates




### Personal Current Transfer Receipts: 2013 Forsyth Co. Total = \$791,105,000

### Transfer Receipts as a Percentage of Total Personal Income 2008-2013




### Persons Living Below the Poverty Level 2013 Model-Based Estimates

#### Civilian Labor Force Average Annual Unemployment Rates











# 2013 Farm Gate Value by Commodity Group Forsyth Co. Total Value = \$15,623,551





## Commuting to Work: 2009-2013 5 Yr. Average – American Community Survey




