



Population Composition by Age Wayne County











Highest Level of Educational Attainment: 2010-2014 5 Yr. Avg. – American Community Survey




Percent of Persons Age 25+







Median Household Income 2014 Model-Based Estimates





Transfer Receipts as a Percentage of Total Personal Income 2009-2014









Components of 2015 Property Tax Gross Digest Wayne County





2014 Farm Gate Value by Commodity Group Wayne Co. Total Value = \$80,202,775






