



### Population Composition by Age Jackson County





### Population Change: 2010-2016









### Median Household Income 2016 Model-Based Estimates





### Transfer Receipts as a Percentage of Total Personal Income 2010-2016







#### Civilian Labor Force Average Annual Unemployment Rates











# 2016 Farm Gate Value by Commodity Group Jackson Co. Total Value = \$297,342,493




#### 1% Sales & Use Tax Distributions: 2016 Jackson Co. Total = \$9,748,411
